Thank you to all the tax payers who are making a worthwhile effort to pay their taxes it is very much appreciated. Arrears are steadily coming in and it seems that tax collecting by courts, etc. are at an all time low. Anyone who feels that they are eligible to receive a tax discount should contact the Town Office for the application form. The amount you can claim was attached to the first newsletter of 2017 for your convenience. Only Property Tax can be discounted and the minimum payment is \$271.00 for Property and Garbage Tax. This does not include Sewer Tax.
