Tax Arrears from Previous Years

Thank you to all the tax payers who are making a worthwhile effort to pay their taxes. It is very much appreciated. Arrears are steadily coming in and it seems that tax collection by courts, etc. are at an all time low. The town can now also place a lien against any property in arrears to the town which would interfere with selling, transferring or giving your house to another person. Notices of these actions were placed in with the 2018 invoices and no other notices will be given if the arrears are not paid.

Anyone who believes that they are eligible to receive a tax discount should contact the Town Office for the application form. The amount you can claim depends upon the total amount of income into each household. \$0 - \$20,000 – 50%
\$20,001-\$22,000 – 45%
\$22,001-\$24,000 – 40%
\$24,001-\$26,000 – 35%
* Only Property Tax can be discounted and the minimum payment is \$271.00 for Property and Garbage Tax. This does not include Sewer Tax.

On March 17, 2018 The Annual Community Breakfast will be held on Saturday morning 8:00am to 11:00am at the Traytown Town Hall. Breakfast consists of homemade beans, bologna, french toast, pancakes, toutons, fruit, juice, tea/coffee and water will be served \$8.00.

Traytown Recreation Committee will be holding its AGM (Annual General Meeting) on Sunday March 18th, at 4:00pm please come out and become a part of this committee the more involvement from community members the greater the programming we can provide for all ages in the local area. Traytown Recreation has received a grant in the amount of \$1,000.00 to expand the Community Garden. Tax payments

Please be advised that the town has set up a payee account for anyone who cannot get into the office with payments. When doing your online banking go bills under payee and find TRAYTOWN (TOWN) and use your Municipal Assessment Agency Parcel ID number as your

account number. If you need your number it is on your assessment that came out in October as well as your town tax invoice that came out in January. The first three numbers of the Parcel ID number is 263-. If you cannot find it contact the town office if you are unsure of your parcel ID number.
