BUSINESS ARISING: April 15, 2024

Capital Works –After a several attempts the power poles are put in place for the tower. Deputy Mayor Harmon has been informed by Ryan Chaulk, Newfoundland Power that the tower could be wired this week or as soon as the authorization has been received. As soon as Greatario has certified the tower the council will have to let people know they can join onto the water supply. The system will have to be monitored every day to make sure a boil order is not needed. A cheque arrived from government in the amount of \$389.50 stating it is for work on water and sewer project no invoices were issued by Allnorth that council is aware of, could be last payment to Cougar on government's 90%.
